Some Important Facts

- The oversized coal trucks are running from 5 am to 3 am.
- 2. There are about 12 trucks on the road right now but the Mine wants to move 3.6 million tonnes of coal each year. That means about 60 trucks - 5 times more trucks than what we have on the road right now!
- 3. The coal trucks are not subject to spring weight restrictions.
- 4. The coal trucks are degrading our highways and are making our roads unsafe to drive on.
- 5. Since 2017 there has been talk of a dedicated road to bypass Glace Bay. At this moment it remains unpaved and unfinished. Kameron Coal has no plans to pave it or use it at this time.
- 6. It's time the mine made their own road to transport coal from their gate to the port.

the area.
